2015 SUMMIT: BEST PRACTICES

OCTOBER 6, 2015

SUMMIT 2015 was fantastic! A full day of relevant, high-quality class sessions enabled attenders to take a fresh look at "Best Practices" in the non-profit industry. Four agencies were chosen by a drawing to participate in the "Rapid-Fire" Rounds over the lunch hour. Each organization offered a 2-minute presentation about their mission to help promote collaboration.

Our deepest appreciation goes to the Hal & Charlie Peterson Foundation for their financial support, which allowed for the recruitment of top-notch educators. Additionally, with over 80 attendees, networking took place in a big way! 43 different nonprofit organizations were represented at Summit 2015. 7 of which were first-time attendees!



The Big Give S.A. is a 24-hour day of giving that takes place from midnight to midnight one day each year. Hundreds of local nonprofits unite to increase public awareness of the impact local nonprofits make in addressing our community's social challenges, bring nonprofits and donors together, expand the idea of online giving, connect people to the causes that move them the most and, of course, make giving FUN. Turning giving into a shared region-wide experience significantly impacted South Central Texas and made a huge collective difference.

The 2015 event raised \$4,307,291.86 for all the participating agencies! Our own Hill Country area raised \$53,585 in Kerr County, \$21,755 in Gillespie County and \$29,211 in Bandera County. The Big Give S.A. is part of the national day of giving called Give Local America. Communities across the country unite (usually on a specified date each May) to make an even bigger impact!

DESIGNATED FUNDS | Designated Funds are established by a donor (or donors) who name specific organizations to benefit from the fund. In other words, donors can specify or designate that a particular charitable organization or project will receive the income from an endowed fund. This type of fund meets the ongoing need for stable financial support that a charitable organization will be able to count on into perpetuity.


