Freddie devoted his life to children through his summer camping profession as well as through volunteerism in the Hill Country community. He believed that our children are our future. These scholarships were set up in his memory to continue to encourage and support local kids to be successful and productive citizens through education and/or camping.

1. The applicant must complete the scholarship application online at www.communityfoundation.net.
2. Applicant must be a student currently graduating from **Kerr County**.
3. Applicant must have at least a 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA).
4. Applicant must be considered a full time student by the college/university or trade school he/she attends.
5. Applicant must be accepted in an accredited college/university or trade school prior to the completion of the award process.
6. Applicant must provide **two letters of reference from non-family members (must be attached to online scholarship)**.
7. Applicant should exemplify good character, integrity, responsibility and leadership.
8. Applicant may be requested to appear for a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee.
9. Each scholarship is a one-time award. Recipients may not reapply for the scholarship.
10. The scholarship award is null and void if not used within one year of the award date.
11. Application (with all requested attachments) must be complete to be considered.

Application deadline is 12 noon, January 24, 2018

All applications must be completed online; no paper submissions will be accepted
